now available in paperback sepherraziel also called liber salomonis is a full grimoire in the solomonic tradition from a sixteenth century manuscript it contains seven books the clavis concerned with astrology and its use in magic with precise interactions between planets signs and houses the ala outlining the magical virtues of stones herbs and animals the tractatus thymiamatus which determines perfumes and suffumigations used in the art a treatise of timesdetailing the correct hours of the day for each operation a treatise on preparationson ritual purity and abstinence samaim on the different heavens and their angels and finally a book of namesand their virtues and properties being seven semiforas of adam and seven semiforas of mores the sepher razieltext is given in two forms a literal transcription with no changes in spelling or wording and a modern english version this volume also includes a foreword which offers an overview of raziel manuscripts which represent a number of independent traditions an essay on

the literature of solomonic magic in english an introduction to the sepher razielmanuscript presented an appendix on incense nomenclature as a supplement to tractatus thymiamatus a list of printed notices and manuscript sources of sepher raziel and a full bibliography of printed works on solomonic magic and items of related interest

sepher raziel also called liber salomonis is not the same as the hebrew sepher raziel ha melakh it is a full grimoire in the solomonic tradition from a 1564 century english manuscript derived from latin sources as such it is one of the earliest grimoires produced in this series it begins with directions for making the parchment pen and ink of art required to write the names it contains seven separate treatises 1 liber clavis which is concerned with astrology and its correct use in magic something long forgotten by modern astrologers with the precise interactions between planets signs and houses 2 the ala outlines in four sections the magical virtues of stones herbs and beasts and words 3 the tractatus thymiamatus explains why incense is essential to magical operations and the effect of various incenses on the spirits with a list of the key perfumes and suffumigations an appendix gives the modern and botanical names 4 the treatise of times gives details of the correct hours of the day and night for each operation with associated angels and the proper names of the sun moon and planets to be used in each season this is something left out of almost all other grimoires 5 the treatise on purity explains the exact preparations and the reasons for ritual purity 6 samaim is a treatise on the seven heavens with the names of their angels 7 the book of virtues and miracles is a treatise on the semiforas the names of god and how they are to be used in invocation to produce miraculous results

michael a morgan translates mordecai margaliath s text of sepher ha razim a fourth century ce magical text into english sepher ha razim includes a story about the book s transmission from the angel raziel to noah eventually down to solomon six sections describing the nature function magical praxis and angelic inhabitants of six of the heavens and the divine throne in the seventh heaven with parallels to talmudic passages enochic literature and hekhaloth literature sepher ha razim sheds light on greco roman magic in general and more specifically jewish life in the early centuries ce

the liber salomonis referred to in its own composition as the sepher raziel claims to be a book given directly to king solomon by a mysterious prince and sorcerer from the east actually written in the renaissance or perhaps as early as the medieval period it synthesizes kabbalistic and hermetic lore together and is divided into seven treatises the subject matter ranges from the high occult of invocation and the names of angels and of the judeochristian god to herbal medicine and the creation of incense for the calling of spirits to the categorization of twenty four beasts and stones to coincide with the hours of the day with the entire core of the work ruled over by seven angels and seven celestial bodies the philosophy behind its somewhat apocryphal historical content is nonetheless of extreme interest and is here presented in modernized english for the modern audience 82 pages

this is the first translation with commentary of selections from the zohar the major text of the kabbalah the jewish mystical tradition this work was written in 13th century spain by moses de leon a spanish scholar

a practical guide to the famed medieval book of pre kabbalistic jewish magic freshly interpreted and revealed for the first time with instructions on how to use the spells the sword of moses is one of the earliest jewish magic books which describes a rite for adjuring angels to assist in controlling and wielding the sword of moses for magical purposes the rite involves a short period of purification and then the adjuring of four sets of angels each higher than the last these angels in turn give the magician the power to control the sword through a series of divine names that work as magical spells the spells 137 in all have a wide variety of uses including healing harm love sex exorcising demons divination and more this work was first translated by moses gaster in 1896 but he

removed many of the spells making the text unusable for magic the magic of the sword of mores is the first book to show in detail exactly how a magician can use the sword how to do the purification ritual adjure the angels and pronounce and use the divine names for each spell

the original work has been a favorite of both scholars and laypeople for its straightforward style in contrast to other medieval writings on ethics that are largely theoretical and reflective

the contributors and editors dedicate this volume of research to professor stefan c reif on the occasion of his 75th birthday together these twenty papers reflect our appreciation for his exemplary scholarship and lifelong commitment to acquaint our world with the theological and cultural riches of jewish studies this collection reflects the breadth of prof reif s interests insofar as it is a combination of second temple studies and jewish studies on the roots of jewish prayer and liturgy which is his main field of expertise contributions on biblical and second temple studies cover amos ben sira esther 2 maccabees judith wisdom qumran psalms and james contributions on jewish studies cover nuptial and benedictions after meals adon olam passover seder amidah the medieval palestinian tefillat ha shir and other aspects of rabbinic liturgy moreover the regional diversity of scholars from israel continental europe the united kingdom ireland and north america mirrors stefan s travels as a lecturer and the reach of his publications the volume includes a foreword of appreciation and a bibliographic list of professor reif s works

the book was never the end it was only the beginning with the sefer raziel in hand rachel races to escape with it before anyone discovers her hidden within the pages of the book are secrets that could destroy armies and reshape worlds certainly enough to bring rachel s pursuers to their knees except she can t read it as redeemers close in and escape from the planet s surface restricted rachel has no choice but to trust someone who betrayed her and hope she isn t making an even worse mistake

the sepher bahir is one of the foremost works of all mystic judaism an important work of kabbalah in which commentaries on sounds

words and stories are presented in a somewhat choppy form for it was a compiled manuscript not a primordial single work the work is ascribed to a mystic rabbi named nehunya circa the first century it refers as well to another mystic work the famous sepher yetzirah equally as renowned for its spiritual lore

muriel mccarthy this volume originated from a seminar organised by richard h popkin in marsh s library on july 7 8 1994 it was one of the most stimulating events held in the library in recent years although we have hosted many special seminars on such subjects as rare books the huguenots and irish church history this was the first time that a seminar was held which was specifically related to the books in our own collection it seems surprising that this type of seminar has never been held before although the reason is obvious since there is no printed catalogue of the library scholars are not aware of its contents in fact the collection of books by late seventeenth and early eighteenth century european authors on for example such subjects as biblical criticism political and religious controversy is one of the richest parts of the library s collections some years ago we were informed that of the 25 000 books in marsh s at least 5 000 english books or books printed in england were printed between 1640 and 1700

deities demons and angels became important protagonists in the magic of the late antique world and were also the main reasons for the condemnation of magic in the christian era supplicatory incantations rituals of coercion enticing suffumigations magical prayers and mystical songs drew spiritual powers to the human domain next to the magician's desire to regulate fate and fortune it was the communion with the spirit world that gave magic the potential to purify and even deify its practitioners the sense of elation and the awareness of a metaphysical order caused magic to merge with philosophy notably neoplatonism the heritage of late antique theurgy would be passed on to the arab world and together with classical science and learning would take root again in the latin west in the high middle ages the metamorphosis of magic laid out in this book is the transformation of ritual into occult philosophy against the background of cultural changes in judaism graeco roman religion and christianity this volume the first in the new series groningen studies in cultural change offers the papers presented at the workshop the metamorphosis of magic from late antiquity to the early modern period held from 22 to 24 june 2000 and organised by jan n bremmer and jan r veenstra the papers have been written by scholars from such varying disciplines as classics theology philosophy cultural history and law their contributions shed new light upon several old obscurities they show magic to be a significant area of culture and they advance the case for viewing transformations in the lore and practice of magic as a barometer with which to measure cultural change

an investigation of the evidence in talmudic gnostic apocalyptic partristic and legendary texts concerning immortal winged beings

the zohar hebrew lit splendor or radiance is the foundational work in the literature of jewish mystical thought known as kabbalah it is a group of books including commentary on the mystical aspects of the torah the five books of moses and scriptural interpretations as well as material on mysticism mythical cosmogony and mystical psychology the zohar contains discussions of the nature of god the origin and structure of the universe the nature of souls redemption the relationship of ego to darkness and true self to the light of god and the relationship between the universal energy and man its scriptural exegesis can be considered an esoteric form of the rabbinic literature known as midrash which elaborates on the torah the zohar is mostly written in what has been described as a

cryptic obscure style of aramaic aramaic the day to day language of israel in the second temple period 539 bce 70 ce was the original language of large sections of the biblical books of daniel and ezra and is the main language of the talmud the zohar first appeared in spain in the 13th century and was published by a jewish writer named moyses de le n de le n ascribed the work to shimon bar yochai rashbi a rabbi of the 2nd century during the roman persecution who according to jewish legend hid in a cave for thirteen years studying the torah and was inspired by the prophet elijah to write the zohar this accords with the traditional claim by adherents that kabbalah is the concealed part of the oral torah

the hebrew goddess demonstrates that the jewish religion far from being pure monotheism contained from earliest times strong polytheistic elements chief of which was the cult of the mother goddess lucidly written and richly illustrated this third edition contains new chapters of the shekhina

limited leather quarter bound collector s edition solomonic magic is a major part of the grimoire tradition this volume is about the methods of solomonic magic used in alexandria and how they have been passed via byzantium the hygromanteia to the manuscripts of the latin clavicula salomonis and its english incarnation as the key of solomon jewish techniques like the use of pentacles oil and water skrying were added along the way but solomonic magic despite its name remained basically a classical greek form of magic amazingly this transmission has involved very few changes and the technology of magic has remained firmly intact the emphasis in this book is upon specific magical techniques such as the invocation of the gods the binding of demons the use of the four demon kings and the construction of the circle and lamens the requirements of purity sexual abstinence and fasting have changed little in the last 2000 years and the real reasons for that are explained the use of amulets talismans and phylacteries or lamens is outlined along with their methods of construction the structure of a solomonic evocation puts into perspective the reasons for each step the use of thwarting angels achieving invisibility sacrifice love magic treasure finding and the binding imprisoning and licensing of spirits the facing directions and timing of evocations have always been crucial and these too have

remained consistent practical considerations such as choice of incense the timing of the cutting of the wand utilisation of rings and statues use of the table of evocation or the acquisition of a familiar spirit are also explained techniques of solomonic magic is thus a follow on book from techniques of graeco egyptian magic this volume is based on the magicians own handbooks rather than the opinions of theologians historians anthropologists sociologists or legislators the emphasis is on what magicians actually did and why tools used by magicians in 7th century alexandria 15th century constantinople and 19th century london are very much the same more than 70 illustrations many in colour of magical equipment like the wand the sword wax images and magical gems drawn from a wide range of manuscripts are reproduced and examined this is the most detailed analysis of solomonic magic from the inside ever penned
