for the first time ever a comprehensive biography of one of the twentieth century's most innovative creative artists the incomparable irreplaceable jim henson he was a gentle dreamer whose genial bearded visage was recognized around the world but most people got to know him only through the iconic characters he created kermit the frog bert and ernie miss piggy big bird the muppets made jim henson a household name but they were only part of his remarkable story this extraordinary biography written with the generous cooperation of the henson family covers the full arc of henson's all too brief life from his childhood in Ieland mississippi through the years of burgeoning fame in washington d c new york and london to the decade of international celebrity that preceded his untimely death at age fifty three drawing on hundreds of hours of new interviews with jim henson's family friends and closest collaborators as well as unprecedented access to private family and company archives including never before seen interviews business documents and henson's private letters brian jay jones explores the creation of the muppets henson's contributions to sesame street and saturday night live and his nearly ten year campaign to bring the muppet show to television jones provides the imaginative context for henson's non muppet projects including the richly imagined worlds of the dark crystal and labyrinth as well as fascinating misfires like henson's dream of opening an inflatable psychedelic nightclub or of staging an elaborate all puppet broadway show an uncommonly intimate portrait jim henson captures all the facets of this american original the master craftsman who revolutionized the presentation of puppets on television the savvy businessman whose deal making prowess won him a reputation as the new walt disney and the creative team leader whose collaborative

ethos earned him the undying loyalty of everyone who worked for him here also is insight into henson s intensely private personal life his christian science upbringing his love of fast cars high stakes gambling and expensive art and his weakness for women though an optimist by nature henson was haunted by the notion that he would not have time to do all the things he wanted to do in life a fear that his heartbreaking final hours would prove all too well founded an up close look at the charmed life of a legend jim henson gives the full measure to a man whose joyful genius transcended age language geography and culture and continues to beguile audiences worldwide

the pixel as the organizing principle of all pictures from cave paintings to toy story the great digital convergence of all media types into one universal digital medium occurred with little fanfare at the recent turn of the millennium the bit became the universal medium and the pixel a particular packaging of bits conquered the world henceforward nearly every picture in the world would be composed of pixels cell phone pictures app interfaces mars rover transmissions book illustrations videogames in a biography of the pixel pixar cofounder alvy ray smith argues that the pixel is the organizing principle of most modern media and he presents a few simple but profound ideas that unify the dazzling varieties of digital image making smith s story of the pixel s development begins with fourier waves proceeds through turing machines and ends with the first digital movies from pixar dreamworks and blue sky today almost all the pictures we encounter are digital mediated by the pixel and irretrievably separated from their media museums and kindergartens are two of the last outposts of the analog smith explains engagingly and accessibly how pictures composed of invisible stuff become visible that is how digital pixels convert to analog display elements taking the special case of digital movies to represent all of digital light his term for pictures constructed of pixels and drawing on his decades of work in the field smith approaches his subject from multiple angles art technology entertainment business and history a biography of the pixel is essential reading for anyone who has watched a video on a cell phone played a videogame or seen a movie 400 pages of annotations prepared by the author and available online provide an invaluable resource for readers

an essential biography of one of the bible s most influential books during its 2 500 year life the book of genesis has been the keystone to almost every important claim about

reality humanity and god in judaism and christianity and it continues to play a central role in debates about science politics and human rights with clarity and skill acclaimed biblical scholar ronald hendel provides a panoramic history of this iconic book exploring its impact on western religion philosophy science politics literature and more hendel traces how genesis has shaped views of reality and how changing views of reality have shaped interpretations of genesis literal and figurative readings have long competed with each other hendel tells how luther s criticisms of traditional figurative accounts of genesis undermined the catholic church how galileo made the radical argument that the cosmology of genesis wasn t scientific evidence and how spinoza made the equally radical argument that the scientific method should be applied to genesis itself indeed hendel shows how many high points of western thought and art have taken the form of encounters with genesis from paul and augustine to darwin emily dickinson and kafka from debates about slavery gender and sexuality to the struggles over creationism and evolution genesis has shaped our world and continues to do so today this wide ranging account tells the remarkable story of the life of genesis like no other book

a new york times notable book the babylonians invented it the greeks banned it the hindus worshipped it and the christian church used it to fend off heretics today it s a timebomb ticking in the heart of astrophysics for zero infinity s twin is not like other numbers it is both nothing and everything zero has pitted east against west and faith against reason and its intransigence persists in the dark core of a black hole and the brilliant flash of the big bang today zero lies at the heart of one of the biggest scientific controversies of all time the quest for a theory of everything within the concept of zero lies a philosophical and scientific history of humanity charles seife s elegant and witty account takes us from aristotle to superstring theory by way of egyptian geometry kabbalism einstein the chandrasekhar limit and stephen hawking covering centuries of thought it is a concise tour of a world of ideas bound up in the simple notion of nothing

this book deals with the controversial value of the sources on which the biography of muhammad the founder of islam is based discussions on this topic have been going on for more than a century but it has become especially debated during the last two decades this volume contains ten articles which are the outcome of an international

colloquium on the issue part one of the book examines the development of the muslim tradition concerning the life of muhammad while the other part focuses on the historical reliability of the source material the volume reflects not only the most recent methodological developments in the study of the life of muhammad but also the improvement of its material basis due to sources which have only recently become available or which have been neglected

from the moment colin firth took on the role of mr darcy in the 1995 bbc adaptation of pride and prejudice emerging from the lake in that scene he was set on a path from sex symbol to national treasure and hollywood star with roles ranging from hugh grant s love rival in bridget jones to an oscar nominated turn as a gay university professor in a single man firth s skills as a versatile actor have known no bounds yet it was his recent portrayal of george vi in the 2011 film the king s speech that has elevated him to hollywood royalty bagging him numerous awards including the much coveted oscar for best actor however it is not only his assumed roles but the man himself who has captured the hearts of audiences the world over this first ever biography also reveals his early life in nigeria the secrets of his escape to canada with actress meg tilly the birth of their first son and his heartbreak as the relationship floundered the passionate affair with pride and prejudice co star jennifer ehle and his whirlwind romance with his italian wife livia fascinating revelatory and suffused with firth s own dry wit this is a must read book on the man of the moment

in this authoritative unsparing history of the biggest rock group of the 1970s spitz delivers inside details and analysis with his well known gift for storytelling people from the author of the iconic bestselling history of the beatles the definitive account of arguable the greatest rock band of all time rock star whatever that term means to you chances are it owes a debt to led zeppelin no one before or since has lived the dream quite like jimmy page robert plant john paul jones and john bonham in led zeppelin bob spitz takes their full measure separating myth from reality with his trademark connoisseurship and storytelling flair from the opening notes of their first album the band announced itself as something different a collision of grand artistic ambition and brute primal force of english folk music and african american blues spitz s account of their artistic journey amid the fascinating ecosystem of popular music is irresistible but the music is only part of the legend led zeppelin is also the story of how the sixties became the seventies of how innocence became decadence of how rock took over led zeppelin wasn t the first band to let loose on the road but as with everything else they took it

to an entirely new level not all the legends are true but in spitz's careful accounting what is true is astonishing and sometimes disturbing led zeppelin gave no quarter and neither has bob spitz led zeppelin is the long awaited full reckoning the band richly deserves

a times literary supplement best book of the year drawing on an exceptional combination of skills as literary biographer novelist and chronicler of london history peter ackroyd surely re creates the world that shaped shakespeare and brings the playwright himself into unusually vivid focus with characteristic narrative panache ackroyd immerses us in sixteenth century stratford and the rural landscape the industry the animals even the flowers that would appear in shakespeare's plays he takes us through shakespeare's london neighborhood and the fertile competitive theater world where he worked as actor and writer he shows us shakespeare as a businessman and as a constant reviser of his writing in joining these intimate details with profound intuitions about the playwright and his work ackroyd has produced an altogether engaging masterpiece

when serge gainsbourg died in 1991 france went into mourning françois mitterand himself proclaimed him our baudelaire our apollinaire gainsbourg redefined french pop from his beginnings as cynical chansonnier and mambo influenced jazz artist to the ironic yé yé beat and lush orchestration of his 1960s work to his launching of french reggae in the 1970s to the electric funk and disco of his last albums but mourned as much as his music was gainsbourg the man the self proclaimed ugly lover of such beauties as brigitte bardot and jane birkin the iconic provocateur whose heavy breathing je t aime moi non plus was banned from airwaves throughout europe and whose reggae version of the marseillais earned him death threats from the right and the dirty old boy wordsmith who could slip double entendres about oral sex into the lyrics of a teenybopper ditty and make a crude sexual proposition to whitney houston on live television gilles verlant s biography of gainsbourg is the best and most authoritative in any language drawing from numerous interviews and their own friendship verlant provides a fascinating look at the inner workings of 1950s 1990s french pop culture and the conflicted and driven songwriter actor director and author that emerged from it the young boy wearing a yellow star during the german occupation the young art student trying to woo tolstoy s granddaughter the musical collaborator of petula clark juliette greco and sly and robbie the seasoned composer of the lolita of pop albums histoire de melody nelson the cultural icon who transformed scandal and song into a new form of delirium

examines tobacco its first users how it goes from leaf to cigarette and the effects of tobacco on health

s n ejedepang koge is a well read man who inspires many people young and old from a large african family he has always lived in a large household he gradually emerged into modernity from this traditional socialization through a determined pursuit of western education always preparing concurrently for two certificates because he wished to be amongst the best at any time privileged in a mass of the disadvantaged he believes in sharing so as to help others to rise as a result he always asserts that a house is never full his house is always full of school children and civil servants who came to chase their

files in yaounde to the extent that his house was called a bakossi embassy whenever his children stayed for sometime without guests in the house they worried and asked whether they had angered visitors there is always something to eat and those who require assistance for transportation or to complete their files always receive it a professional teacher mr ejedepang koge has worked with the church and the government he had the advantage of working in many parts of his country cameroon he also served as cultural counsellor at cameroon embassy in washington dc he learnt to live with joy and pain and in the diversities of his country he is approachable and patient with all types of people he stresses that no one should be treated with disdain for every individual has something to offer at one time or other of our life intent on promoting education he is co founder of three private schools in cameroon

on the morning of 9 february 2014 when sam smith woke up and saw the four statuettes he d taken home from the previous night s grammy awards ceremony it must have felt like a dream come true at only twenty two years old and coming just eight months after the us release of his debut album in the lonely hour calling sam smith s victory an overnight success story seemed wholly appropriate in fact sam had been working towards releasing his own music for over a decade and training his voice for even longer after falling under the spell of whitney houston and chaka khan as a child straining his voice to imitate them and match their incredible vocal ranges tuition from a local jazz singer and time spent in a local theatre group and youth choir encouraged sam to pursue singing as a career but sam s first attempts to become a professional singer floundered and left him disillusioned and jaded by the time he turned eighteen sam had seen six different managers come and go he d recorded a whole album s worth of songs which were never released and he was beginning to think he d never get his big break then in 2010 giving himself one more year to make it sam moved to london after spending a year working full time in a bar a chance encounter with elvin smith a fellow musician turned artist manager changed sam s life forever in just over eighteen months sam s voice had featured on a number one song and he was about to sign his own major label deal the songs sam wrote for his debut album would go on to capture the hearts of a massive international audience along the way there were celebrity friendships number one records world tours and the inevitable press speculation

about his personal life in this revealing biography joe allen charts the meteoric rise of britain's singing sensation with his multi platinum debut barely scratching the surface of what we can expect from sam in the future the next decade is sure to be as eventful as the last

his way is the only authorised biography of new zealand prime minister robert muldoon one of the dominant political figures of the last half century in that country his way was based on many hours of conversation with muldoon himself as well as colleagues friends and family and wide access to the prime minister s official and private papers and diaries leading political biographer barry gustafson shows muldoon is shown as a champion of the ordinary people whose vision over time became anachronistic and inflexible

the photograph from the air of the university of montreal built 1928 1945 on mount royal by quebec born architect engineer ernest cormier 1885 1980 trained in paris that whole period was very important for developing the province of quebec the building was built on the north side of the mountain with the enormous old cemetery easily visible and the st lawrence river just visible on the other side today such a photograph would no longer be so striking the whole area has many more impressive buildings and enormous trees cover the area we lived a ten minute walk away from the bottom left

hand corner of the picture in outremont the francophone counterpart of anglophone westmount two miles or so to the west the head office of family medicine was situated close to and just to the west of the big tower it is from there that the bethune chinese connection was established i was at the uofm from 1975 1995 it was by far the most productive period of our professional lives
