a major history of the british empire s early involvement in the middle east napoleon s invasion of egypt in 1798 showed how vulnerable india was to attack by france and russia it forced the british empire to try to secure the two routes that a european might use to reach the subcontinent through egypt and the red sea and through baghdad and the persian gulf promised lands is a panoramic history of this vibrant and explosive age charting the development of britain s political interest in the middle east from the napoleonic wars to the crimean war in the 1850s jonathan parry examines the various strategies employed by british and indian officials describing how they sought influence with local arabs mamluks kurds christians and jews he tells a story of commercial and naval power boosted by the arrival of steamships in the 1830s and discusses how classical and biblical history fed into british visions of what these lands might become the region was subject to the ottoman empire yet the sultan s grip on it appeared weak should ottoman claims to sovereignty be recognised and exploited or ignored and opposed could the sultan s government be made to support british objectives or would it always favour france or russia promised lands shows how what started as a geopolitical contest became a drama about diplomatic competition religion race and the unforeseen consequences of history

photographs of people places and goings on that show what life was like in new england between 1855 and 1920

they were in the words of one contemporary observer the promised lands in all of europe only northern italy could rival the economic power and cultural wealth of the low countries in the later middle ages in the promised lands wim blockman

the mexican province of texas is about to experience a shattering war that will bring both tragedy and promise to this episode of american history

popular culture stories found in comic strips tv programs magazines and movies gain their popularity by evoking our desires and anxieties aden offers a well constructed argument that creating a sense of place and with it a sense of personal identity and community serves as an important enticement for many popular cultures works aden handles contemporary theory deftly and does an excellent job of identifying many of the tensions present in 20th century america quarterly journal of speech stories encountered at the movies on television and in popular magazines are treated as reflections of the popular culture believing that the american experience has been guided by a normative narrative or grand narrative that constitutes the american dream aden holds that stories

can be used to extract the rules of a narrative determine the direction and identify conceptions of the promised lands for a culture critical studies in mass communication

the first comprehensive political history of oregon to the promised land also examines the social and economic changes the state has pioneered during its almost two hundred years highlighting major political figures campaigns ballot measures and the history of legislative sessions tom marsh traces the evolution of oregon from incorporated territory to a state at the forefront of national environmental and social movements from jason lee s first letter urging congress to take possession of the oregon country to john kitzhaber s precedent setting third term as governor from the land frauds of the early 20th century to the state s land use planning goals from the beach bill to the bottle bill this book tells oregon s story featuring interesting trivia historical photographs and biographical sketches of key politicians to the promised land is an essential volume for readers interested in oregon s history

the conflict between israel and the palestinians has profoundly affected the middle east for almost seventy years and shows no sign of ending with two peoples claiming the same piece of land for different reasons it remains a huge political and humanitarian problem can it ever be resolved if so how these are the basic questions addressed in a new and substantially revised fifth edition of this highly acclaimed book having lived and

worked in the middle east at various times since 1968 colin chapman explains the roots of the problem and outlines the arguments of the main parties involved he also explores the theme of land in the old and new testaments discussing legitimate and illegitimate ways of using the bible in relation to the conflict this new and fully updated edition covers developments since 9 11 including the building of the security wall the increased importance of hamas and the islamic dimension of the conflict and the attacks on lebanon and gaza

nestled in neighborhoods of varying degrees of affluence suburban public schools are typically better resourced than their inner city peers and known for their extracurricular offerings and college preparatory programs despite the glowing opportunities that many families associate with suburban schooling accessing a district s resources is not always straightforward particularly for black and poorer families moving beyond class and race based explanations inequality in the promised land focuses on the everyday interactions between parents students teachers and school administrators in order to understand why resources seldom trickle down to a district s racial and economic minorities rolling acres public schools raps is one of the many well appointed suburban school districts across the united states that has become increasingly racially and economically diverse over the last forty years expanding on charles tilly s model of relational analysis and drawing on 100 in depth interviews as well participant observation and archival research r l heureux lewis mccoey examines the pathways of resources in raps he discovers that due to structural factors social and class positions and past experiences resources are not valued equally among families and even when deemed valuable financial factors and issues of opportunity hoarding often prevent certain raps families from accessing that resource in addition to its fresh and incisive insights into educational inequality this groundbreaking book also presents valuable policy orientated solutions for administrators teachers activists and politicians

in lost tribes and promised lands celebrated historian and cultural critic ronald sanders offers a compelling and ideology shattering history of racial prejudice and myth as shaped by political religious and economic forces from the 14th century to the present day

tells the riveting narrative of the growth disappearance and eventual rediscovery of one of the largest free black communities of the nineteenth century in 1966 a group of students boy scouts and local citizens rediscovered all that remained of a then virtually unknown community called weeksville four frame houses on hunterfly road the infrastructure and vibrant history of weeksville an african american community that had become one of the largest free black communities in nineteenth century united states were virtually wiped out by brooklyn s exploding population and expanding urban grid weeksville was founded by african american entrepreneurs after slavery ended in new york state in 1827 located in eastern brooklyn weeksville provided a space of physical safety economic prosperity education and even political power for its black population who organized churches a school orphan asylum home for the aged newspapers and the national african civilization society notable residents of weeksville such as journalist and educator junius p morell participated in every major national effort for african american rights including the civil war drawing on maps newspapers census records photographs and the material culture of buildings and artifacts wellman reconstructs the social history and national significance of this extraordinary place through the lens of this local community brooklyn s promised land highlights themes still relevant to african americans across the country

ian buruma s maternal grandparents bernard and winifred bun win wrote to each other regularly throughout their life together the first letters were written in 1915 when bun was still at school at uppingham and win was taking music lessons in hampstead they were married for more than sixty years but the heart of their remarkable story lies within the span of the two world wars after a brief separation when bernard served as a stretcher bearer on the western front during the great war the couple exchanged letters whenever they were apart most of them were written during the second world war and their correspondence is filled with vivid accounts of wartime activity at home and abroad bernard was stationed in india as an army doctor while win struggled through wartime privation and the blitz to hold her family together including their eldest son the later film director john schlesinger midnight cowboy sunday bloody sunday and twelve jewish children they had arranged to be rescued from nazi germany their letters are a priceless record of an assimilated jewish family living in england throughout the upheavals of the twentieth century and a moving portrait of a loving couple separated by war by using their own words ian buruma has created a spellbinding homage to the sustaining power

of a family's love and devotion through very dark days

land reform and the possibility of expropriation without compensation are among the most hotly debated topics in south africa today met with trepidation and fervour in equal measure but these broader issues tend to obscure a more immediate reality a severe housing crisis and a sharp increase in urban land occupations in promised land karl kemp travels the country documenting the fallout of failing land reform from the under siege philippi horticultural area deep in the heart of cape town's ganglands to the burning mango groves of tzaneen from johannesburg's lawless deep south to rural kwazulu natal where chiefs own vast tracts of land on behalf of their subjects he visits farming communities beset by violent crime and provides gripping on the ground reporting of recent land invasions with perspectives from all sides including land activists property owners and government officials kemp also looks at burning issues surrounding the land debate in south africa corruption farm murders illegal foreign labour mechanisation and eviction and reveals the views of those affected touching on the history of land conflict and conquest in each area as well as detailing the current situation on the ground

tells the story of two families one jewish and one arab who lived for generations in the valley outside of jerusalem their story is told from the rise of zionism and the 1948 war for israel s independence to the present palestinian uprisings

from 1940 to 1970 nearly four million black migrants left the american rural south to settle in the industrial cities of the north and west competition in the promised land provides a comprehensive account of the long lasting effects of the influx of black workers on labor markets and urban space in receiving areas traditionally the great black migration has been lauded as a path to general black economic progress leah boustan challenges this view arguing instead that the migration produced winners and losers

within the black community boustan shows that migrants themselves gained tremendously more than doubling their earnings by moving north but these new arrivals competed with existing black workers limiting black white wage convergence in northern labor markets and slowing black economic growth furthermore many white households responded to the black migration by relocating to the suburbs white flight was motivated not only by neighborhood racial change but also by the desire on the part of white residents to avoid participating in the local public services and fiscal obligations of increasingly diverse cities employing historical census data and state of the art econometric methods competition in the promised land revises our understanding of the great black migration and its role in the transformation of american society

in this book isaiah friedman examines one of the most complex problems that bedeviled middle east politics in the interwar period one that still remains controversial the prevailing view is that during world war i the british government made conflicting commitments to the arabs to the french and to the jews through a rigorous examination of the documentary evidence friedman demolishes the myth that palestine was a twice promised land and shows that the charges of fraudulence and deception leveled against the british are groundless central to arab claims on palestine was a letter dated 24 october 1915 from sir henry mcMahon the british high commissioner in egypt to king hussein the sharif of mecca pledging arab independence friedman shows that this letter was conditional on a general arab uprising against the turks predicated on reciprocal action the letter committed the british to recognize and uphold arab independence in the areas of the fertile crescent once it was liberated by the arabs themselves as all evidence shows few tribes rebelled against the turks the arabs in palestine syria and mesopotamia fought for the ottoman empire against the british in addition to its non binding nature mcMahon s letter has been misinterpreted with respect to the territories it covers friedman s archival discovery of the arabic version actually read by hussein indisputably shows that palestine was not included in the british pledge indeed hussein welcomed the return of the jews just as his son emir feisal believed that arab jewish cooperation would be a means to build arab independence without the interference of the european powers myth shattering and meticulously documented palestine a twice promised land is revisionist history in the truest sense of the word

governing oregon presents a broad and comprehensive picture of oregon government and politics as we approach the start of the third decade of the twenty first century shedding light on the profound changes that have remade oregon politics in recent years the book also seeks to make it clear that much has also remained the same the editors of this collection have relied upon leading scholars from six different oregon universities current and former state leaders in oregon s executive and judicial branches and

individuals involved in tribal government and policymaking to tell the ongoing story of government in oregon

you never realize what the good old days are until you re no longer living in them in may 1943 seventeen year old clint brodsky learns this lesson the hard way when german forces invade and attack the us mainland as clint s hometown of mayfield ohio is left in ruins he is forced to overcome and adapt to this macabre new world he once called home constantly questioning his own moral compass as he finds himself doing things he normally wouldn t even consider clint must conquer his deepest fears for the sake of his newborn baby sister violet and the girl he learns to love hazel clint must grow and mature to keep the ones he loves safe all the while dealing with the natural feelings and dilemmas an impressionable teenager is bound to have this coupled with his hopes of finding a better world is what drives him but what will happen when his own need for revenge and his instinct to survive drive him in the opposite direction

whether seen as a land of opportunity or as paradise lost the american west took shape in the nation s imagination with the help of those who wrote about it but two groups who did much to shape that perception are often overlooked today promoters trying to lure settlers and investors to the west insisted that the frontier had already been tamed that the only frontiers remaining were those of opportunity through posters pamphlets newspaper articles and other printed pieces these boosters literally imagined places into existence by depicting backwater areas as settled culturally developed regions where newcomers would find none of the hardships associated with frontier life quick on their heels some of the west s original settlers had begun publishing their reminiscences in books and periodicals and banding together in pioneer societies to sustain their conception of frontier heritage their selective memory focused on the savage wilderness they had tamed exaggerating the past every bit as much as promoters exaggerated the present although they are generally seen today as unscrupulous charlatans and tellers of tall tales david wrobel reveals that these promoters and reminiscers were more significant than their detractors have suggested by exploring the vast literature produced by these individuals from the end of the civil war through the 1920s he clarifies the pivotal impact of their works on our vision of both the historic and mythic west in examining their role in forging both sense of place within the west and the nation s sense of the west as a place wrobel shows that these works were vital to the process of identity formation among westerners themselves and to the construction of a west in the national imagination wrobel also sheds light on the often elitist sometimes racist legacies of both groups through their characterizations of native americans african americans mexican americans and asian americans in the era wrobel examines promoters painted the future of each western place as if it were already present while

the old timers preserved the past as if it were still present but as he also demonstrates that west has not really changed much promoters still tout its promise while old timers still try to preserve their selective memories even relatively recent western residents still tap into the region's mythic pioneer heritage as they form their attachments to place promised lands shows us that the west may well move into the twenty first century but our images of it are forever rooted in the nineteenth

if we are to learn anything of value from the murders and mass suicide at jonestown its history must be salvaged from popular myths which are little more than superficial atrocity tales in this superb cultural history john r hall presents a reasoned analysis of the meaning of jonestown why it happened and how it is tied to our history as a nation our ideals our practices and the tensions of modern culture hall de-ates the myths of jonestown by exploring the social character of jim jones' people's temple how much of what transpired was unique to the group and its leader and how much can be explained by reference to wider social processes

this inspired collection of stories is cause for celebration with stunning language and dazzling characters toure introduces soul city a wholly imagined utopia where magic happens and black is beautiful in a broad range of characterization and styles the portable promised land is filled with lighthearted humor and heavyhearted issues toure challenges form and what's considered politically correct in stories like the sad sweet story of sugar lips shinehot and afrolexicolgy today's bi-annual list of the top 50 words in african america the portable promised land marks the entrance of a new and wildly compelling voice to fiction

seattle times essential for those interested in tubman and her causes larson does an especially thorough job of uncovering relevant documents some of them long hidden by history and neglect the plain dealer larson has captured harriet tubman s clandestine nature reading ms larson made me wonder if tubman is not in fact the greatest spy this country has ever produced the new york sun

this compelling autobiography narrates the story of immigration rights activist mary antin and her enlightening journey from early life in russia to her migration and americanisation in late nineteenth century usa the promised land is an introspective first hand account of life as a jewish american immigrant mary antin was just 12 years old when she arrived in boston with her family and she underwent a great deal of change and development before she could call the usa her home antin s autobiography details how the young jewish girl escaped czarist russia and adapted to an entirely new culture and lifestyle antin explores her memories of public school and accompanies powerful historical context with hard hitting political commentary the promised land is one person s story but speaks for the millions who have had all too similar experiences this gripping volume includes fascinating chapters such as children of the law daily bread the exodus the initiation my country a child s paradise now in a new edition read co books have republished this illuminating autobiography for a new generation of readers the promised land is a great read for those interested in the history of immigration rights and for fans of mary antin s work

passage for jewish girls characterized as a lifelong supporter of women s rights kaplan s family including his wife and four daughters played a role in shaping his ideas about women culture and zionism this was especially true of his second daughter hadassah kaplan who joined a small but influential cohort of american jewish women who studied worked and volunteered in british mandate palestine promised lands provides a window into the lives of american jewish women in both new york city s upper west side and palestine during the interwar period by tracing hadassah s journey the volume offers a sense of what drew this generation of adventurous women to palestine and helps us to understand their impact on american jewry drawing on a rich personal archive of diary entries photographs and letters sharon ann musher displays how unconventional women like hadassah kaplan were able to challenge cultural norms and experiment with ideological commitments while still remaining good daughters wives and mothers their knowledge and experience in volunteering philanthropy and education within the united states helped them to build jewish institutions and communities abroad and to center zionism in american jewish education institutions and identity crafting a compelling portrait of an influential jewish woman promised lands showcases the legacy of hadassah kaplan and her fellow travelers on american jewish life
